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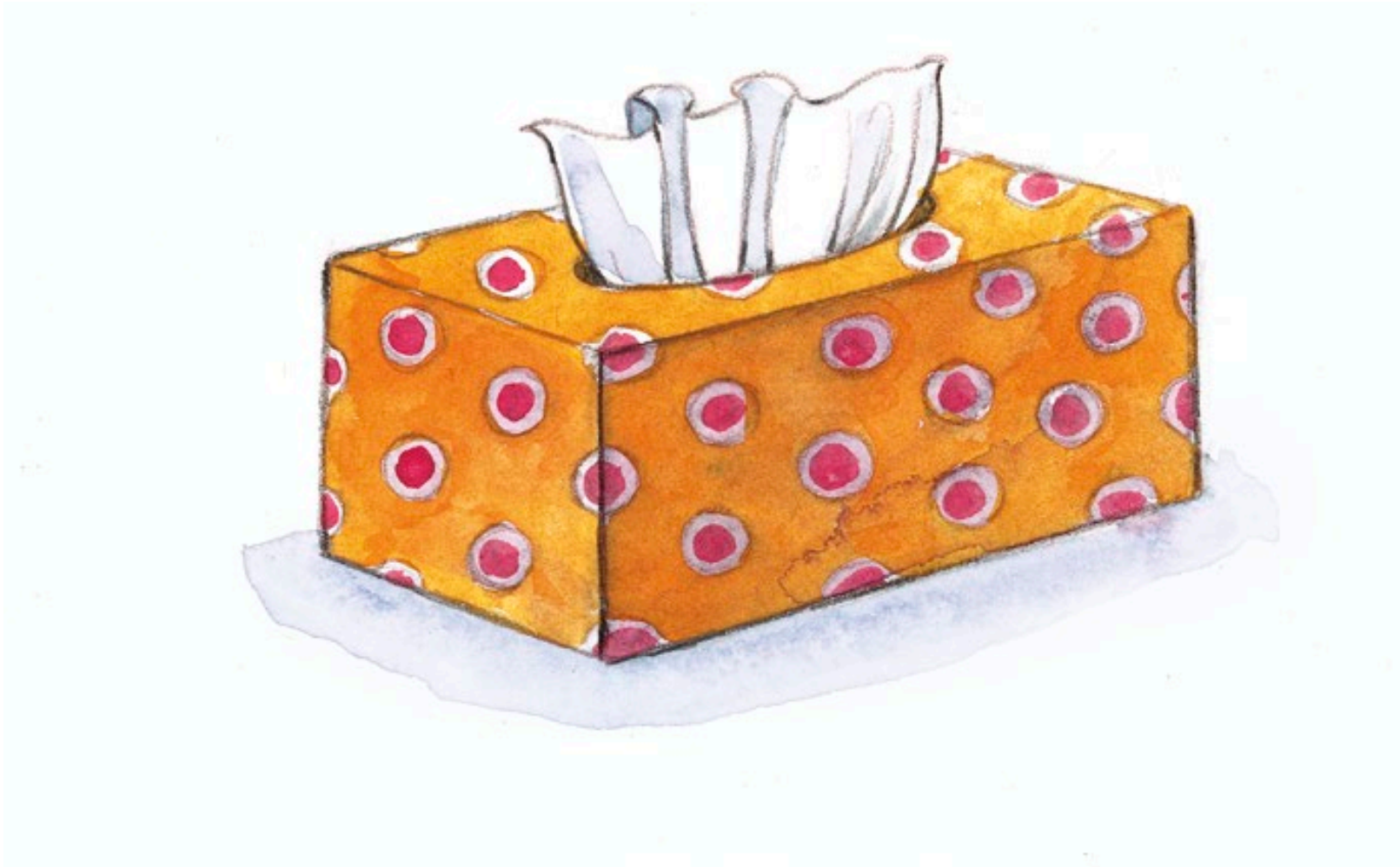
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Chapter 1

again and again and again.

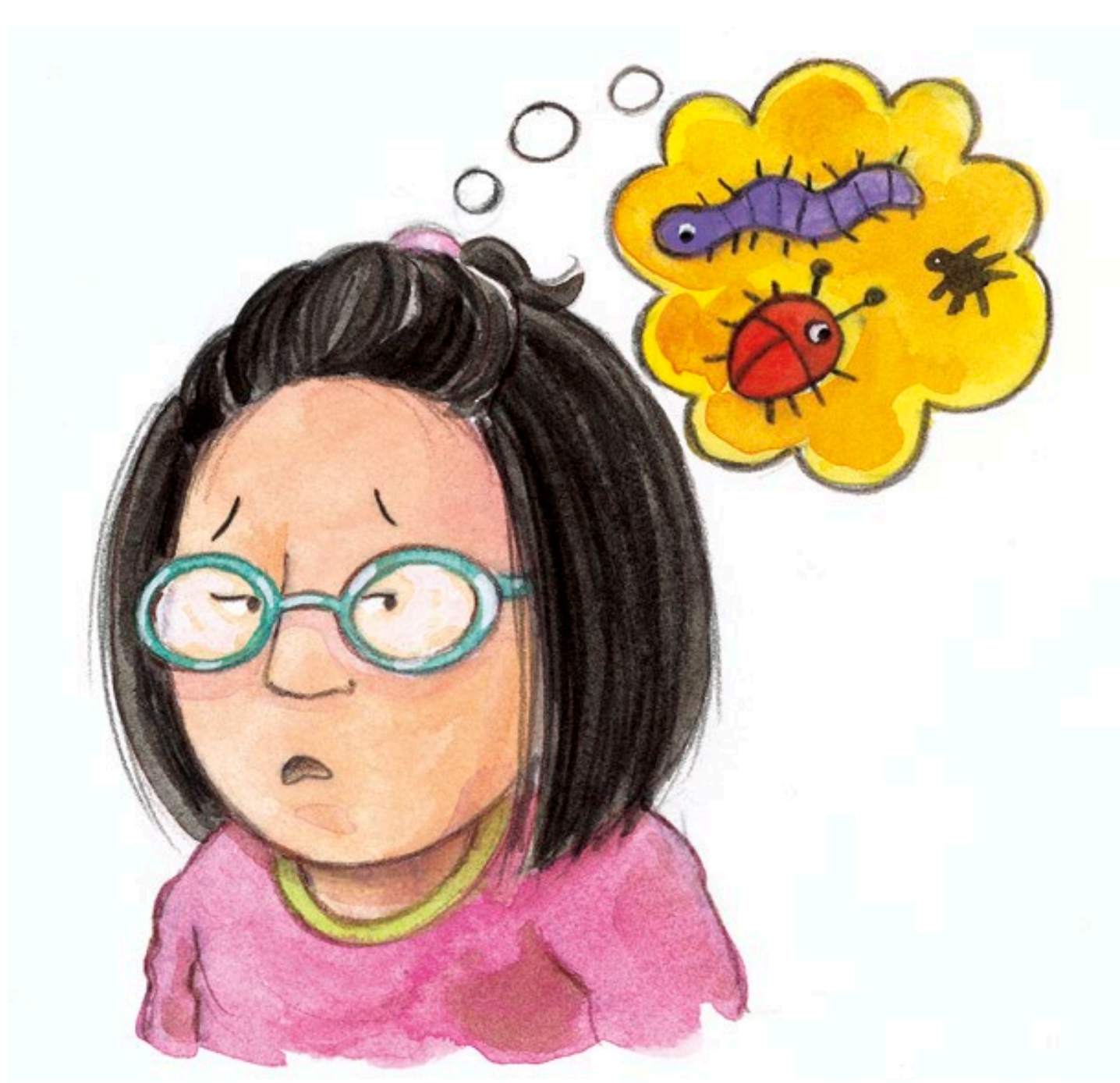
“I feel funny,” said Katie.

Katie moaned.

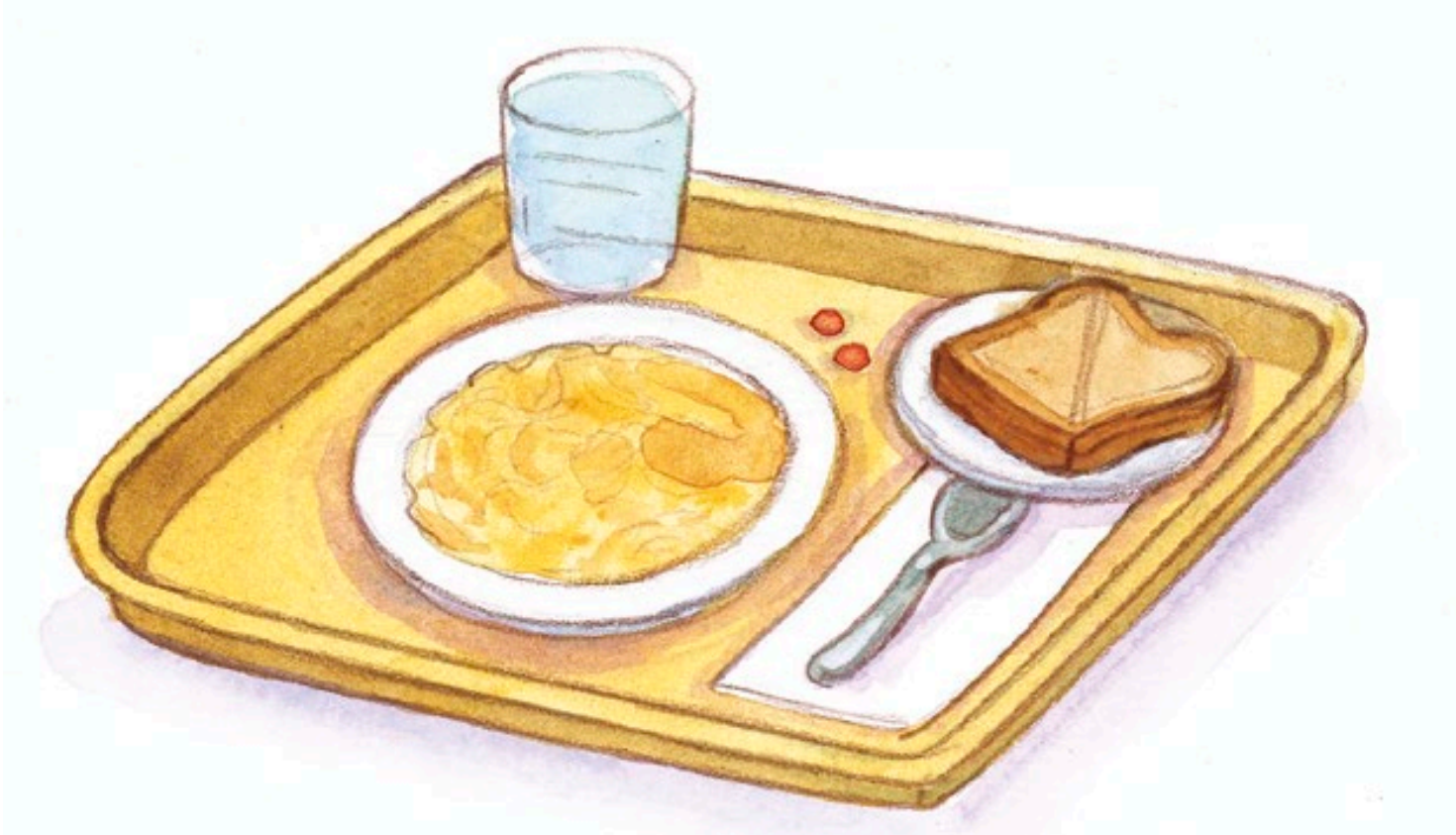


“Don’t worry,” her mom assured her. “You’re not ice cream. You won’t melt.”
